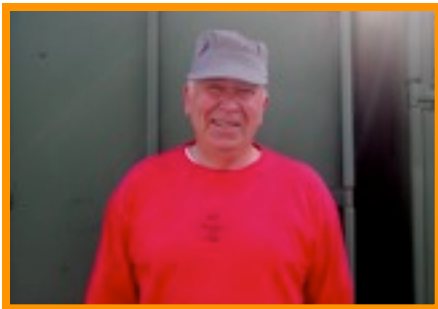

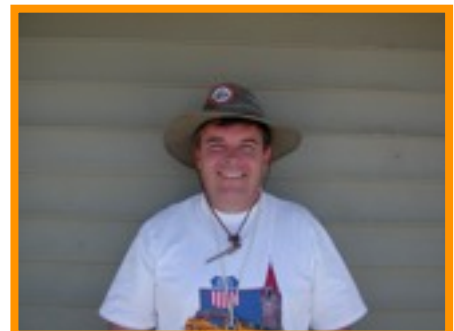

# A FIRST CLASS RAILROAD

January was a very successful month. The club had a total of 3107 riders on the run weekend. Saturday 1457 riders were pulled and Sunday 1650 riders were pulled. Five trains were operating on Saturday and four trains were operating on Sunday. Needless to say the crews and station staff were busy all day. The gift shop was also busy. So please stop and say thank you to the ladies who do such an excellent job. The funds contributed by sales in the gift shop are important to the club's well being.

The yearly total of volunteer hours contributed to the operation of our First Class Railroad have been compiled by Carol Hunnyman based on your time cards that were signed by a board member or project leader and submitted. The total is 7260 hours, which averages to 605 hours per month. Our most generous member in terms of donated hours is Norm Jobse with 687 hours. He has done more by himself then what the whole club does in a month. All of the 7260 hours were contributed by 60 of the club's approximately 100 regular members. The board hopes to plan projects for the coming year that will allow all members the chance to contribute substantial hours to the clubs operations and maintenance. The projects include: gravel storage crib, a new siding and two new spurs, extensive tie and rail replacement and additional roadbed gravel width to facilitate the proposed handicap cars. Some members may note the extra leg clearance in container H. Last workday the left middle track shelf was modified to allow better clearance when walking down the left side of the container. Similar modifications can be made to allow more walking clearance in other containers given that the rolling stock stored therein will permit the modifications.

Don't forget to get your dues in before January 31 as the new roster will be compiled at that time based on paid dues. Also don't forget to reserve you space at the annual banquet on Feb. 28. The sooner we get a head count the better we can plan. Please **mail your dues checks to OCME** so they can be correctly and expeditiously counted. **Mail your banquet checks to Lori Tolan** for the same reason. ## Marilyn Donnelly

Marilyn Merselis was born in Passaic, New Jersey in 1928 and married to Bob Donnelly in 1952. He was in the Army during the Korean War, so after our wedding we moved to Boston, Mass. where he was stationed, then from there to Ft. Sill, Lawton, Oklahoma, and finally to Ft. Bliss, Texas where he was honorably discharged in 1954. We have two married sons and three granddaughters.

I am a graduate of Greenbrier College for Women in Lewisburg, West Virginia, where I served as the President of the Glee Club and Vice President of the Senior Class, and received my degree in music.

I sang professionally in many Long Island, NY churches and synagogues. However, after settling in as a mom, I volunteered my services to the Community Presbyterian Church of Malverne as soloist and Jr. Choir Director. For several years Bob served as an elder and the head of the Christian Education Committee. We were, also, active in the Couples Club of the Church.

We lived in Malverne, Long Island, N.Y. for 12 years, until Bob's company, Fiat Motor Co., transferred us to California in 1971. We bought a home in Costa Mesa and have lived in the same home for 36 years. In 1981, Fiat no longer had a

dealer organization in the United States, and after 24 years with the company, Bob was without employment.

Fortunately, Disneyland had a job for Bob in Security. He thoroughly enjoyed working at the "Happiest Place on Earth". Bob discovered OCME was looking for volunteers to help build their railroad which is located at what is now "Fairview Park" in Costa Mesa. Bob dedicated a lot of his time building this railroad and running the trains; a very worthy project.

OCME opened a shop on the premises, and I have volunteered my time working in that shop every third weekend of the month for the past 10 or 11 years. It is a commitment; but a worthy one. It has been a great experience--particularly watching the joy of the children who "ride the trains". If only Bob had lived to see the "fruit of his labors" but, sadly, he passed away in 2004 after a 13 month bout with pancreatic cancer. He would have been so proud.

In addition to volunteering at OCME, I enjoy playing bridge and play as often as I can, and I enjoy belonging to PEO (Philanthropic Education Organization for Women) where I have served as Chaplain, Treasurer and Vice President over a period of 20 years. My enjoyment also includes music of all kinds and love going to the wonderful Performing Arts Center here in Costa Mesa.

I feel so fortunate to live here: Costa Mesa is indeed the City of the Arts.
