New Goat Hill Station

The Orange County Model Engineers have been fortunate to be the recipient of many Boy Scout Eagle projects. Some of these projects include the beautiful awing outside the Club house and the retaining wall on the Mountain Division. In August we are going to have our Station re-built as part of an Eagle Scout project.

Thomas Bunning is a member of Boy Scout Troop 636. He is currently working on a service project that will help him attain the final rank of Eagle. His project will be to re-build our Station, which has been standing for almost twenty years and it is beginning to decay because of termite damage, dry rot, wear from weather, and general use. He will be rebuilding the passenger waiting area of the Station, replacing all the damaged materials, and ensuring that the structure will continue to serve its purpose for years to come. After being restored, our Station will once again be used to benefit thousands of families who have experienced the Mackerel Flats Goat Hill Junction Railroad.

Thomas and those helping him will be working on our new Station during the weekends of August 22nd and 23rd and August 29th and 30th. This project will cost approximately \$2,500.00. This is a lot of money for Thomas to solicit. He intends to ask the City of Costa Mesa for permission

to have a BBQ during one of our public run weekends so he may raise the needed funds.

A FIRST CLASS RAILROAD

During May and June, two important projects were completed that enhance the Mackerel Flats and Goat Hill Junction Railroad infrastructure. The gravel crib was completed and the crossings for Higgins and Matassa were widened at the bridge. The gravel crib will hold a double truckload of gravel. The drains around it and the cinder block wall will protect the Hank Hornsveld Bridge from ground water damage. You remember last year we had to replace one of the bridge bents. The extended crossings will allow the gravel truck to back in and dump its load in the gravel pit thus making it more convenient for us. The next step is to reconnect the water line out to the Mehren water tower for our steamers. Pictures of the ravel pit during and after construction are shown on other pages of this Way Freight. The cinder block wall and bridge were already targeted by graffiti vandals. Any time you see graffiti please report it to a board member right away so we can call the Costa Mesa Graffiti Hot Line at 714-327-7491.

Thursday June 11th, 2009 is a day to remember. The 509 was delivered after 32 months on order. People take 9 months, elephants take 24 months, trains take a bit longer. It was securely crated as you can see in the pictures on other pages of this Way Freight. The riding car was on top of the 509 engine. The whole kit and caboodle was off loaded and then inspected and given a short test run. It looks and runs very nicely. There are a couple of things that will be done before it will be used to pull the public in July. A red flashing light has been connected to the fuel pump switch so we will have positive information to remind us to turn off the switch. Also hoses and wiring will be examined to insure that there is no chaffing. Stronger safety chain attachments will replace the current ones. Washers will be added to the king pins so that the trucks will not drop far when re-railing is required. The Kill switch is being replaced so that it cannot be inadvertently be activated. Run time hour and rpm meters are also being installed. The 509 will be housed in the current 596 location; and the 596 will be moved to container "C" across from the Santa Fe. In order to run the new 509 you must be an OCME Engineer and checked out by Bob Brooks, Myron Peterson, or Terry Cummings. The 509 is a little different then the 1104 so be sure and be checked out.
