We are trying to make the past problem track areas safer and more reliable. The added responsibility of making sure our guests can operate their equipment safely and smoothly while we conduct the public run days will require we have additional man power. Experience has shown us we need better than normal communications, and additional responsibilities, such as coordinating activities for the meet and crowd control - remember "crowd' - can be as little as one person in the wrong place at the wrong time. Please sign up to help us have a successful meet and public run together. If you have any problems with scheduling, availability, transportation, or other meet related problems, contact either Dixon Sheldon or myself, and we will do our best to resolve them.

Track issues are popping up more and more lately, Much of our main line is or has reached the end of its life cycle. We are trying to approach the problems with scheduling the areas in need of repair and/or replacement with a priority list based on condition and usage of the track, if you want to know more of the criteria we are using contact either Myron Peterson, Terry Cummings, or me. Panels need to be assembled for the replacement tracks. To ensure the different types of panels needed are constructed correctly, please get help from the members that are checked out on the current panel building processes.

We have two work trains made up for track maintenance, one work engine is housed in container B with ballast cars and tool cars. The second work train is housed in container C - the engine for the second train should be either the Santa Fe or the Chessie, and the work gondolas are stored on the center track.
