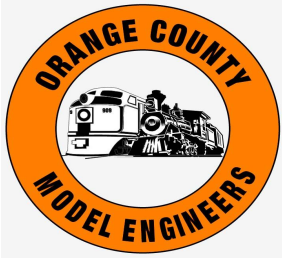

To date approximately 3300 feet of track and switches have been replaced along the mainline and the "Y"s since the effort was started in May of 2014. HIGH IRON CONTINUED

1. Cosmetic repair and cleaning of the 596 and the Santa Fe engines.
2. Replace the wooden water tower with the steel one stored in the compound.
3. Replace the deteriorated side railings on the bridge.
4. Adjust the top storage rail in all containers to better align with the rolling bridge.
5. Repaint the transfer table as well as the rolling bridge.
6. Finish painting the steaming bays.
7. Repair, and make operational, the crossing gate south of the station.
8. Inspect the roofs of all storage containers and repair any leaks.
9. Here's a big one...repaint all the storage containers in the compound. (We need to start somewhere)
10. Build new track panel tables.

Meeting Summary

WEIGHT LIMIT UPDATE

We have a new sign at the station on run weekends. It replaces an older one that was rather tattered. It lets riders know what the safety rules are for riding our trains. Item #10 was modified and now reads, **"LOAD LIMIT PER RIDING CAR IS 750 LBS."** We have removed the old rule that limited an individual's weight. Now we must monitor the weight of **EACH CAR** as we load public on run weekends. That means that larger riders may need to have fewer other riders on the same car with them. In some cases it may be necessary for a rider to have a car to themselves. Please try to remember this when loading your trains...it's our responsibility to **NOT** overload cars. Let's all help one another remember this... *"If you see something, say something"*.
